### In brief

«COP in MyCity is a youth-led project that ambitions mostly to bridge the gap between yearly climate negotiations and the mainstream public, foster education and action about climate change, and create an international community around climate change.

COP in MyCity team organizes a climate talk simulation. The simulation consists in a role-playing event in which participants mimic the structure of an international negotiation conference following all its procedures.

During that simulation, around 30 participants are organized in assigned delegations, and then negotiate on a global agreement to limit global warming and finance the environmental transition.»
